The Town of Belville and NCDOT Work Together to Mitigate Localized Flooding After Tropical Storm Debby

Addressing the After Effects of Severe Storms is a Major Focus for Belville, N.C.

BELVILLE, N.C. - In the days following Tropical Storm Debby, which brought significant rainfall and flooding to Southeastern North Carolina, the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the Belville Public Works Department are working together to mitigate flooded areas within the community.

The Town of Belville continues to address the aftermath of Tropical Storm Debby and the resulting flooding throughout the Woodridge, River Ridge, and Olde Towne communities.

Currently, an NCDOT crew is on-site at the intersection of River Birch Ridge Court and Two Pine Road, working diligently to alleviate the flooding caused by the significant rainfall brought on by the storm.

“Their swift response and continued presence in our community has been crucial in mitigating further damage and ensuring the safety of our residents. We want to express our deep gratitude for the prompt and dedicated efforts of the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) and the town’s contractors, WithersRavenel and Coastal Exterior Solutions,” said Mayor Mike Allen.
