

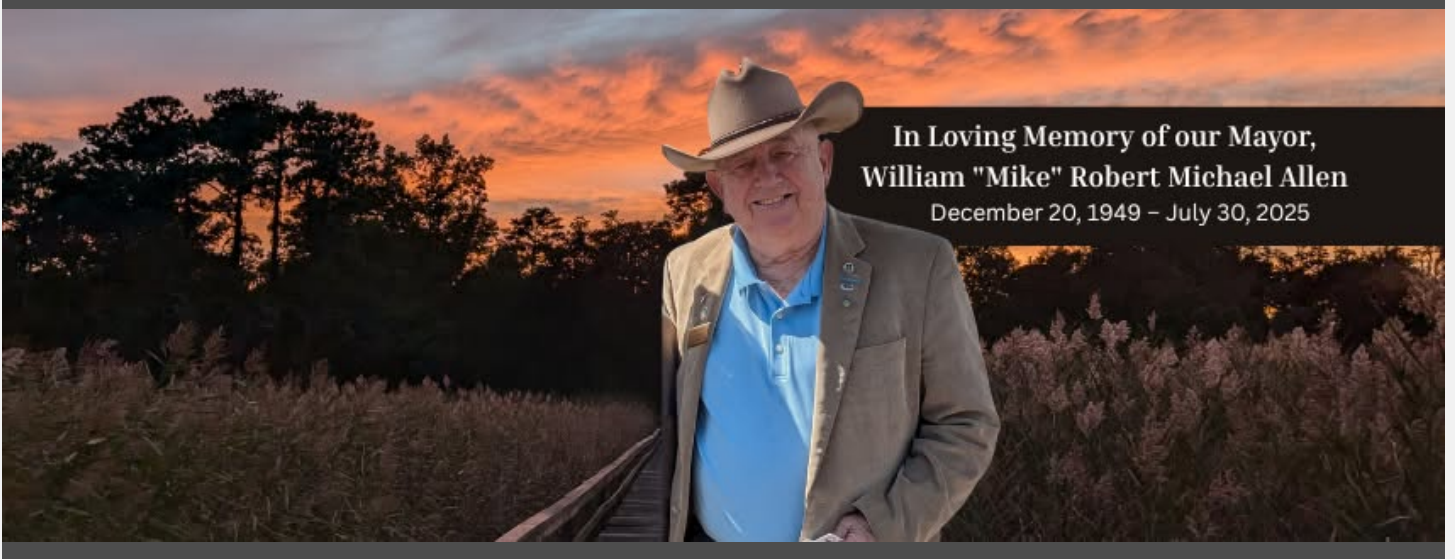

As we enter the month of September, we continue to mourn the loss of our long time Mayor and friend, Mike Allen. The sudden and untimely passing of Mike has left a noticeable void, not only in our town hall, but the Belville community and the greater Brunswick County area. Mike was a living legend, a man larger than life, whose impact will be felt for years to come and pure joy and love for this area greatly missed. I still expect to see him sitting in his office, looking at me with that smirk that always made me smile as he would say something to the effect “well look who it is,” to which I would

crack a joke or ask if he ever went home. I miss the banter – I miss the man and his friendship but especially the ability to just talk about things we wanted to do in Belville and bounce ideas by him. Of course, there would be several stories mixed in with that but that was just the benefit of talking to him, stories that I have heard a thousand times, but I truly miss. But the greatest way to honor the man is to honor his dream for this Town and we are moving forward with them. As the Acting Mayor, I insisted that we began renewed talks with our downtown developer, Urban Smart Growth, to try and come to a resolution to this long, on-going and stagnated project. We also completed our multi-use path (MUP) along River Road, and, after a few additional minor finishing touches, we should be dedicating it soon. The Riverwalk expansion also continues and, after some final meetings with our contractor, we are very close to laying out our construction area and to begin work. This all comes during an election season which I am running to continue being your Mayor. It will not detract or distract me from committing myself to you and this Town as we continue to enjoy living in an incredible area that is Belville, NC!!

Board of Commissioners

July and August BOC Recap

Highlights of the July Board of Commissioners meeting included a Resolution recognizing Athina Williams' 19 years of service with the Town of Belville; a Resolution expressing thanks and appreciation to Cindy Ruggerio as Parks and Recreation volunteer; and a Resolution expressing thanks and appreciation to Gene Ward of the ABC Board. Other items included a Belville Riverwalk Park project update, a Transportation Update, and the release of an on-call engineering Request for Qualifications.

Highlights from the August Board of Commissioners meeting included a presentation to the family of late Mayor Mike Allen with a Presidential Proclamation in recognition for his service and shared condolences with the family for their loss. The Board of Commissioners also acknowledged several staff members for their service to the town: Jace Sanchez (2 years), Linda Nixon (2 years), Jeff Gruenewald (3 years) and finally Randy Collins (for 1 year) work anniversaries. Ian McLeod, Events Coordinator, updated the Commissioners on Park Events and upcoming changes to the Belville Riverwalk Park parking lot, which will include the addition of boat parking in the parking lot. Mr. McLeod also provided updates on Storm Water Mitigation which is a major focus for the Town and Commissioners.

Mayors of Brunswick County August 2025 Meeting

To address these funding challenges, the Mayors of Brunswick County met in Supply for a presentation by Fire Chief's Charles Drew and Chief Keith McGee, and to discuss solutions. Among the attendees were Belville's own Acting Mayor, Chuck Bost, Mayor Pro Tem Ryan Merrill, Madame Town Manager Athina Williams, and Deputy Finance Officer Kerry Wooding. After the session, Acting Mayor Chuck Bost also met with other mayors, including the neighboring towns of Navassa and Leland, to discuss how towns can work together to help.
