Belville's Leash Law

The Town's leash law prohibits animals from running loose off of their owners property. When off your property, pets must be on a leash. This includes when you're taking your pet for a walk in your neighborhood, or the Belville Riverwalk Park. [Citations and/or fines will be assessed to owners who do not follow the ordinance.](#)

And please, pick up after your pet.

Multiuse Path Now Officially Open

It's been several years in the making, but the main portion of the Belville multi-use path is now open. There are still smaller sections to be completed, but when finished, this path

will be a little over a mile of greenway (walking and biking path) that connects Belville neighborhoods like Hawkeswater and WestPort Lofts all the way to Blackwell Road and beyond.

Belville Multi-Use Path

Community Greenway
The pathway connects Belville Elementary to multiple communities and soon, to Belville Riverwalk.

Refresh Yourself
Amenities like a water fountain and spigot allow you and your pets to hydrate and refresh yourself.

Safe Access
High visibility crosswalks and other safety features make this path state-of-the-art.

Connected Communities
Walk, jog or bike the 2,750 foot pathway. Marked crosswalks and wide, safe paths guide pedestrians. Once completed this path will be over a mile of greenway.

DMV Belville Office Now Open

As we reported last month, the Department of Motor Vehicles has opened a temporary drivers license office in Belville. The office, located at 25 Old River Road will process drivers licenses and other DMV-related needs.

The Belville DMV Office is now open from Monday-Friday from 8am-5pm. Services include REAL ID and license renewal. Commercial driver licenses and motorcycle skills tests are not offered.

The office is currently serving walk-ins with appointments scheduled to begin in March.

Riverwalk Update

TD Eure, our selected contractor for the Riverwalk extension has driven piles and is thoughtfully clearing woods to extend the Riverwalk walking trails and boardwalk. We'll keep you posted with updates.

When complete, these trails and boardwalks will connect the Belville Riverwalk to our future downtown.

Please, for your safety, do not explore these trails until the work is completed.
